- **Observation at Junctions**
Ineffective observation and judgement
- **Moving away safely**
Ineffective observation
- **Reverse parking**
Ineffective observation or a lack of accuracy
- **Incorrect positioning on the road**
At roundabouts or on bends
- **Use of mirrors**
Not checking or not acting on the information
- **Lack of steering control**
Steering too early or leaving it too late
- **Reversing around a corner**
Ineffective observation or a lack of accuracy
- **Incorrect positioning to turn right**
At junctions and in one way streets
- **Incorrect use of signals**
Not cancelling or giving misleading signals
- **Inappropriate speed**
Travelling too slowly or being hesitant
